KEY FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW



IT'S A ONCE IN A DECADE INVESTMENT

Despite Waterford Union High School's outward appearance, it requires essential repairs and modernization to continue serving students. On February 20, 2024 voters will be asked to address these deficiencies with a two-question referendum:

QUESTION # 1

Addresses failing building systems. Modernizes learning and support areas (including Maple View and Tech Ed areas) Enhances safety, security, and ADA accessibility.

QUESTION #2

Addresses need for ADA parking and permanent restrooms for athletic sites. Repairs stadium lighting, soccer fields, and relocates softball fields. Replaces bleachers, press box, track and field event spaces.

If the proposed investment is approved, the school board took action to place a moratorium on future bond referendums for the following 12 years.

IT'S A FISCALLY-RESPONSIBLE PLAN FOR CONTINUED SUCCESS

After careful consideration and collaborative efforts, the School Board unanimously voted to include two questions on the February 20, 2024 primary ballot. This two-question referendum aims to address all our facility needs at once for a timely, cost-effective solution to our facility problems. This comprehensive approach will lead to more efficient and effective improvements, while reducing the time, costs, and resources needed for short-term fixes and continued referendums.


